The Stuppy Fun Day also includes:

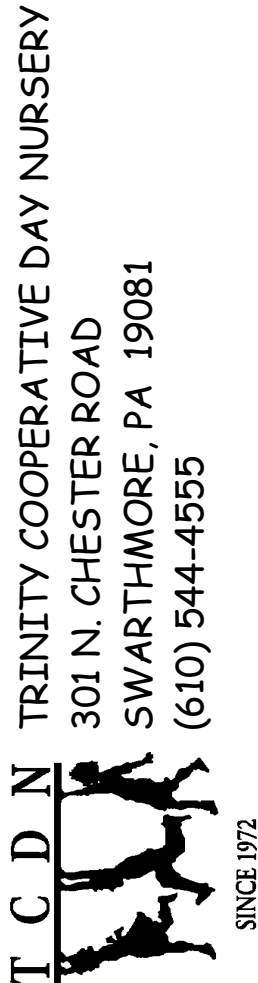

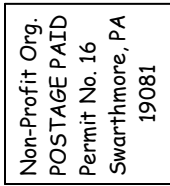

The Stuppy Fun Run was created 25 years ago to honor Leroy Stuppy, a science teacher, respected coach, and beloved father. Megan, his daughter, was a TCDN student when her father drowned accidentally while visiting Yellowstone National Park. As the first beneficiary of the fund named for her father, Megan went on to complete TCDN preschool and school-age programs. Regina Stuppy Keller told Megan before the first Memorial Run, "they're having a run as a memorial to your Dad, and collecting money for other children who can't afford to go to TCDN. It was important to your Dad that you had that opportunity, so now other children may also have it."
